First Responders seem to be taking an awful long time to get there. 30 minutes later someone knocks on your door and asks if you are the person who called 9-1-1. Come to find out the responders couldn't find your house because the house wasn't numbered, illuminated, or there was a tree/bush/decoration in front of your house number. Imagine the help that could have gotten to you an your significant other a lot sooner if that house number was able to be seen from the road.

Or imagine you called 9-1-1 because your loved one is having trouble breathing, gasping for air, and holding their chest with a panic look on their face. You start wondering why nobody is coming to help you! What's going on?? Finally, a knock at the door and someone asks, "Did you call 9-1-1?" By this time your loved one is blue in the face and not responding very well to you. Frustratingly, the responders had to knock on all the apartment doors to find which apartment they needed to be at because none of them were numbered.

Please make sure you have large, easily seen house numbers from the road, and on your apartment doors. This easy step could save a life – could save your life.

HYDRANT FLUSHING MAY 5

The Public Works Department will be flushing hydrants Friday, May 5 starting around 11:00am. Please be aware while the hydrants are being flushed, it stirs up sediment such as iron that has settled. This may turn your water brown. It is not harmful to drink, however, doing laundry at this time is not recommended. If you do have brown water, it is best to flush it out with cold water until it runs clear.

BUILDING PERMITS

Spring is the season for home improvements and projects! If you are planning any projects that require a building permit, such as reroof, new windows, adding a deck, or siding, etc., please remember to obtain a permit before you start work. If you start working on a project without obtaining a building permit, the fee for the permit will be double the original amount of the usual permit. If you are unsure if your project requires

a permit, you can check the City's website for more information or stop at City Hall.

Before digging, be sure to call Gopher State One Call by dialing 811 so they are able to safely locate underground utilities.

Watch What you Flush

Public Works has noticed a lot of nonflushable items in the lift stations. Please refrain from flushing anything other than toilet paper and sewage. Maintenance has been finding syringes and other personal care items which will damage our pumps leading to expensive repairs or replacements.
