Prepping for Winter

As the days grow shorter and the chill sets in, it's time once again to get ready for another MInnesota winter! Whether you're team "Bring on the snow!" or "Wake me up in April," a little preparation now will make the cold months go much smoother.

AROUND THE HOUSE:

Check your furnace filter and test your heating system before the first cold snap. Make sure doors and windows are sealed tight to keep the heat in and drafts out. Stock up on sidewalk salt, sand, and hot cocoa—because once the snow flies, it's always a scramble to find them.

FOR YOUR VEHICLE:

Give your car a winter check-up: battery, tires, and wipers all take a beating in cold weather. Keep a blanket, shovel, flashlight, and scraper in your trunk. It's better to be ready than frosty and frustrated on the side of the road!

SNOW PLOWING AND REMOVAL:

As snow begins to accumulate, the City's Public Works Department will be out keeping our streets safe and passable. A few reminders to help them help us:

Main Street (Highway 238) must remain clear of snow and snow piles at all times. When plows are operating, please avoid parking along the highway. Parked vehicles obstruct equipment and delay operations—so move them around the corner or to an alternate location until plowing is finished.

SIDEWALKS:

Property owners are responsible for clearing snow and ice from sidewalks adjoining their property within 24 hours after snowfall ends. Keeping walkways clear helps ensure safety for everyone.

FIRE NUMBERS & MAILBOXES:

Please keep your fire number signs and mailboxes visible and accessible. This helps emergency crews and postal workers locate your property quickly and safely during snowy conditions.

SNOWMOBILES:

For safety reasons, snowmobiles are not allowed on sidewalks or city park. When traveling through town, please stay along the edge of the street and use caution.

NEIGHBORS HELPING NEIGHBORS:

Winter always goes better when we lend a hand. Check in on elderly neighbors, share a shovel if you see someone struggling, and spread a little warmth (figuratively, of course—keep the cocoa for yourself).

Let's all do our part to keep Upsala safe, cozy, and cheerful this winter. Bundle up, drive safe, and enjoy the sparkle of the season!

Let's Taco 'Bout Dogs, Leashes, and... Well, Poop

We all love our furry friends. They're cute, loyal, and make great walking buddies. But let's be honest—nothing ruins a nice stroll through town faster than stepping in a mystery pile on the sidewalk.



Keep your dog on a leash and clean up after them. Every time. No exceptions.

When your dog is off-leash, it might seem harmless— "Oh, he's friendly!"—but not everyone (or every dog) feels the same way. Plus, a leash keeps your pup safe from traffic, squirrels, and their own questionable life choices.

Wheels in Motion: **Keeping Kids Safe on** Bikes, E-Bikes, Scooters, and Small Dirt Bikes

More kids and teens are

riding around town on bikes, e-bikes, scooters, and small dirt bikes—and while these rides are fun and convenient, they come with responsibilities.

PARENTS: STAY IN THE KNOW

Today's rides can reach higher speeds and may not be legal on sidewalks or city streets. Before your child takes off, check:

Where they're riding and if motorized vehicles are allowed.

How their e-bike, scooter, or dirt bike operates.

When they're riding—avoid dusk or dark hours.

Who they're with and if they know basic safety rules.

RIDE RIGHT AND RESPECTFULLY

- >> Watch for vehicles at driveways & intersections.
- >> Stay alert and avoid phones or earbuds.
- >> Keep speeds under control and ride single-file in groups.
- ➤ Be courteous to pedestrians, drivers, and neighbors.

COMMUNITY SAFETY STARTS AT HOME

A quick parent-to-child conversation about routes, rules, and respectful riding can prevent accidents and keep everyone safe. Let's keep our town a place where kids can explore, play, and ride—safely and responsibly.


